The forum has not spoken about the subject for some years.

- There is no 'hard barrier' that will prevent nuisance motorcycles.
- The only protection is police action to confiscate illegal/untaxed/uninsured vehicles
- There is no local facilities where off road motorcycles can ride. If someone were to use somewhere (like Sundon quarry) as a formal area then riders could be directed to a legitimate venue.
