We feel immensely honoured to have been singled out in this way. Now we will be able to use the Queen's Award logo in our applications for funding and it will certainly help us. We receive no public funding and rely entirely on voluntary contributions to cover our annual running costs of approximately £26,000. Capital expenses incurred are in excess of this figure."
