CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE COUNCIL (DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT FOR BEDFORDSHIRE) (BARTON-LE-CLAY: PART OF FOOTPATH NO 9) MODIFICATION ORDER 2014

The above Order made on 4 April 2014, if confirmed as made will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by varying and adding to the particulars relating to the footpath from OS GR TL 0789 3088 to OS GR TL 0789 3083 by providing that:

Barton-le-Clay Footpath No 9 shall be described as continuing from Ordnance Survey Grid reference (OS GR) TL 0789 3088 (order map - point A) along the centre of a track to terminate at its junction with Sharpenhoe Road at OS GR TL 0789 3083 (order map - point B).

Between OS GR TL 0789 3088 and OS GR TL 0789 3083 the path has a width of 1.8 metres (6 feet).

A copy of the Order and the map may be seen free of charge at the offices of Countryside Access Team, Central Bedfordshire Council, Priory House, Monks Walk, Chicksands, SHEFFORD, SG17 5TQ between 9.00am and 5.00pm on Mondays to Thursdays and between 9.00am and 4.00pm on Fridays. Any representation or objection relating to the Order must be sent in writing to the Senior Definitive Map Officer, Countryside Access Team, Central Bedfordshire Council, Priory House, Monks Walk, Chicksands, SHEFFORD, SG17 5TQ not later than 30 May 2014, and applicants are requested to state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made to the Order, or to any part of it, or if any so made are withdrawn, Central Bedfordshire Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, itself confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State in whole or in part, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
