


Marriage / Civil Partnership ceremonies

Your ceremony



Welcome

Welcome to the Registration Service for the District of Central Bedfordshire.

This guide has been prepared to help you with all the arrangements for your ceremony and explains exactly what happens on the day of your ceremony and what you need to do. It can also act as a souvenir of your special day.

As civil marriages do not require formal rehearsals, we are happy to discuss any aspect of your day with you prior to the ceremony. If you need any further information please contact 0300 300 8089.

Planning you marriage is an important event which we aim to make a very special, memorable and enjoyable occasion.

Your marriage ceremony

It is important that you and your guests arrive at least 15 minutes before your ceremony. This gives everyone time to get settled and seated before we begin and ensures we start your ceremony on time.

If you are late, we may have insufficient time to complete the ceremony without inconveniencing other couples and therefore will have to postpone your ceremony to a later date. If any of your guests are late, we may have to start without them. So please do your best to see that everyone arrives in good time.

If, for whatever reason, you are unable to attend the ceremony, please contact us as soon as possible.

When you arrive

- 1. You will have a brief meeting with the Registrars. This may be conducted separately if you do not wish to see each other before the ceremony starts and will be conducted in private. This is essential to ensure the correct information for the day will be recorded.
- 2. You will be asked to confirm the information given on your notices of marriage, including your natural father's full name and current or last occupations. These details will be recorded in the marriage register and will be on your marriage certificate.
- 3. We will also answer any last minute questions at this time.
- 4. Whilst you are being interviewed your guests and witnesses will be seated in the ceremony room.

Witnesses

You will need to ask two people, who may be friends or relatives, if they will witness your marriage. This is required by law. They should be over the age of 18 and must be able to understand the ceremony. If either party to the marriage has difficulty in speaking or understanding the English language, one of the witnesses must be competent to act as an interpreter. The witnesses must be in the room during the ceremony and must hear the marriage vows spoken

The marriage ceremony

Our Ceremony Staff will begin the Ceremony by welcoming everyone and will then guide you through the different parts of your ceremony such as the declarations, vows, ring exchange and readings, introducing those involved in these parts of the ceremony as required, before you and your witnesses sign the register. You will sign the register in the name that you are using at the time of the ceremony. You and your witnesses will be asked to confirm what you actually sign as it is important that all signatures are recorded correctly to ensure future certificates contain the exact information in the register eg: someone called John Sam Smith may have a signature which says J.Smith, J S Smith or John Smith.

Once the ceremony is complete photographs can be taken. Unfortunately if you arrive late for your ceremony we may not have time for photographs in the Ceremony Room.

The ceremony and the discussions with the Registrar will last about 30 minutes.

Personalising Your Ceremony

You can discuss any part of your ceremony with the Superintendent Registrar. You may have a friend or relative who would like to deliver a reading/a piece of poetry or text. A selection of readings is available at the end of this document.

Music is played for your entrance, during the signing of the register and exit. If you have a personal choice of music, you will need to provide the music either to your Approved Venue or to the Registration Service.

You can also include personal vows which you would both like to say at either the Ring Exchange or in addition to the legal vows.

If you would like to include a reading, extra vows or piece of music in your ceremony, please complete the appropriate part of the checklist in this guide and return it to the Registration Service. For legal reasons, music, readings or additional vows must not be religious and the Superintendent Registrar must approve them before your ceremony. Checklists therefore must be returned to the Superintendent Registrar at least two weeks in advance of your ceremony.

Photos and videos

Your guests are very welcome to take photographs before and after but not <u>during</u> the ceremony. You can designate a guest or an official photographer / videographer to take photographs for you. They must make themselves known to the Ceremony Staff on arrival. We ask that no flash is used during the ceremony, that photographers / videographers be

stationary at all times and that they do not take photographs of the signing of the register. An opportunity for posed shots of the signing will be set up at the end of the ceremony. For safety reasons we cannot allow extra lighting and the equipment must run on batteries.

Car Parking and grounds

Arrangements for throwing confetti, car parking and disabled access vary at each office, so please ask the Superintendent Register for further details. If you are using one of our approved venues please check arrangements with them.
