

Notice of Confirmation of Modification Order
Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981



Definitive Map and Statement for the Former Ampthill Urban and
Rural Districts as at 27 January 2009

CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE COUNCIL (DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT FOR
BEDFORDSHIRE) (CLOPHILL: FOOTPATH NOS 10 AND 11) MODIFICATION ORDER 2010

On 20th September 2012 the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs confirmed the above-named Order without modification.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by adding to them the two footpaths described below.

Footpath No 10 Clophill to be added extends from its junction with the High Street at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OS GR) TL 0926 3822 (Order map - Point A) along Old Church Path in a north north westerly and then northerly direction for approx 228 metres to its junction with Footpath No A2 Clophill at OS GR TL 0920 3843 (order map - Point B) where the path terminates.

The footpath has a variable width of between 3.2 metres and 3.8 metres as delineated by the faces of the buildings and walls or fences or base of the bank on the west side of Old Church Path and the base of the bank on the east side of Old Church Path.

Footpath No 11 Clophill to be added extends from its junction with Great Lane and Footpath No 5 Clophill at OS GR TL 0896 3873 (Order map - point C) in a generally south easterly direction for approx 215 metres to its junction with Footpath No A2 and Old Church Path at OS GR TL 0915 3865 (Order map - point D) where it terminates.

The footpath has a width of 2.5 metres

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of Countryside Access Team, Central Bedfordshire Council, Borough Hall, Bedford, MK42 9AP and may be inspected free of charge between 9.00am and 5.00pm on Mondays to Thursdays and between 9.00am and 4.00pm on Fridays. Copies of the Order and map may be purchased.

The Order comes into force on 20th September 2012, but if a person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or any provision contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under paragraph 12(1) of Schedule 15 to the Act within 6 weeks from 11th October 2012 make an application to the High Court.
