Notice of Confirmation of Public Path Order
Town and Country Planning Act 1990

**CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE COUNCIL (PART OF CRANFIELD FOOTPATH NO 23) PUBLIC PATH
DIVERSION ORDER 2018**

On the 6 July 2018 Central Bedfordshire Council confirmed the above Order made under Section 257 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the following length of public Footpath No 23, Cranfield as shown on the Order map.

The length of Footpath No 23, Cranfield to be diverted extends from Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OS GR) SP 9423 4317 (Order map – point A) in a west north westerly direction for approximately 100 metres to OS GR SP 9413 4320 (Order map – point B).

The alternative highway to be provided and known as Footpath No 23, Cranfield extends from OS GR SP 9423 4317 (Order map – point A) in a generally west south westerly direction for approximately 46 metres to OS GR SP 9419 4316 (Order map – point C) then continues in a generally west south west then north and then west north westerly direction for approximately 73 metres to OS GR SP 9413 4318 (Order map – point D) then continues in a generally northwards direction for approximately 17 metres along an existing grassed track to OS GR SP 9413 4320 (Order map – point B).

The new length of footpath has a width of 2 metres

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the Order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at the offices Central Bedfordshire Council Highways, Priory House, Monks Walk, Chicksands, Shefford SG17 5QT between 9.00am and 5.00pm Mondays to Thursdays and between 9.00am to 4.00pm Fridays. Copies of the Order and map may be bought there at a charge of £4.00.

This Order comes into force on the date on which Central Bedfordshire Council certify that the public footpath described in Article 2 of the Order has been set out to their satisfaction, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Act, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the order, he or she may apply to the High Court for any of these purposes under section 287 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 within 6 weeks from the date on which notice is first published as required by paragraph 7 of Schedule 14 to that Act.
