CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE COUNCIL (DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT FOR
BEDFORDSHIRE) (HARLINGTON: FOOTPATH NO 29) MODIFICATION ORDER
2012

The above Order made on 13th April 2012, if confirmed as made will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by adding the following footpath:-

The length of Footpath No. 29 Harlington to be added extends from Bunyans Walk at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OS GR) TL 0371 3069 (Order Map - point A) in an easterly direction for approximately 19 metres between Nos 4 and 5 Bunyans Walk to OS GR TL 0373 3069 (Order Map - point B) and then continues in a north easterly direction for approximately 57 metres along Churchills to OS GR TL 0378 3072 (Order Map - point C) where it terminates at its junction with Footpath No 1 Harlington.

The footpath has a 1.2 metre width between OS GR TL 0371 3069 (Order Map - point A) and OS GR TL 0373 3069 (Order Map - point B) and a 3 metre width between OS GR TL 0373 3069 (Order map - point B) and OS GR TL 0378 3072 (Order Map - point C).

A copy of the Order and the map may be seen free of charge at the offices of Countryside Access Team, Central Bedfordshire Council, Technology House, Ampthill Road, Bedford between 9.00am and 5.00pm on Mondays to Thursdays and between 9.00am and 4.00pm on Fridays. Copies of the Order and the Order map may be purchased. An explanatory statement can be obtained by phoning 0300 300 6249.

Any representation or objection relating to the Order must be sent in writing to the Orders & Commons Registration Officer, Countryside Access Team, Central Bedfordshire Council, Technology House, Ampthill Road, Bedford MK42 9BD not later than 7th June 2012, and applicants are requested to state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made to the Order, or to any part of it, or if any so made are withdrawn, Central Bedfordshire Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, itself confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State in whole or in part, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
