Notice of Confirmation of Public Path Order
Highways Act 1980

CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE COUNCIL (HAYNES: BRIDLEWAY NO 19) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2018

On the 30th November 2018 Central Bedfordshire Council confirmed the above Order made under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the following length of public Bridleway No 19, Haynes as shown on the Order map.

The length of Bridleway No 19, Haynes to be stopped up extends from Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OS GR) TL 0896 4110 (Order map - point A) in a south westerly direction for approximately 91 metres to OS GR TL 0892 4103 (Order map - point B) where it has a junction with Footpath No 22, Haynes and then continues in a south westerly direction for approximately 546 metres to OS GR TL 0864 4056 (Map point D) where it has a junction with part of Footpath No 19, Haynes.

The length of Bridleway No 19, Haynes to be created extends from Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OS GR) TL 0891 4110 (Order map - point E) in a south westerly direction across a paddock for approximately 56 metres to a field boundary at OS GS TL 0890 4105 (Order map – point F) then continues in a south westerly direction across a meadow for approximately 193 metres to a field boundary at OS GR TL 0879 4089 (Order map - point G) and then continues in a south westerly direction across an arable field for approximately 342 metres to a track at OS GR TL 0864 4056 (Order map - point H) and then continues in a generally southwards direction for approximately 18 metres to terminate at a drain at its junction with Footpath No 19, Haynes at OS GR TL 0864 4056 (Order map - point D). The new route of the bridleway has a width of 4 metres.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the Order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at the offices of Central Bedfordshire Council Highways, Priory House, Monks Walk, Chicksands, Shefford SG17 5QT between 9.00am and 5.00pm Mondays to Thursdays and between 9.00am to 4.00pm Fridays. Copies of the Order and map may be bought there at a charge of £4.00.

The Order comes into force on 28 December 2018, but if a person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 6 December 2018 make an application to the High Court.
