Highways Act 1980

CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE COUNCIL (HOUGHTON CONQUEST: PART OF FOOTPATH NO 8) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2015

The above Order made on 9 January 2015 under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 will divert Footpath No 8 Houghton Conquest as shown on the Order map.

The length of Footpath No 8 Houghton Conquest to be stopped up extends from Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OS GR) TL 0539 4208 (Map point B) in a north easterly direction for approximately 54 metres to OS GR TL 0543 4210 (Map point A).

The length of Footpath No 8 Houghton Conquest to be created extends from Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OS GR) TL 0537 4210 (Map point C) in a north easterly then south easterly direction for approximately 88 metres along a grass arable field edge path until it reaches a culvert at OS GR TL 0543 4210 (Map point A).

The new route of the footpath has a width of 2 metres

A copy of the Order and the Order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at the offices of Countryside Access Team, Central Bedfordshire Council, Priory House, Monks Walk, Chicksands, Shefford between 9.00am and 5.00pm on Mondays to Thursdays and between 9.00am to 4.00pm on Fridays. Any representations about or objections to the Order may be sent in writing to the Senior GIS Officer, Countryside Access Team, Central Bedfordshire Council, Priory House, Monks Walk, Chicksands, Shefford, SG17 5QT not later than 20 February 2015. Please state the grounds on which they are made. Representations and objections must include either a postal or e-mail address. Any representations or objections made will be in the public domain and will be available for viewing/copying by members of the public.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn the Central Bedfordshire Council may confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for confirmation any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the Order and will be made publicly available by either the Council or the Planning Inspectorate.
