Central Bedfordshire Council (“the Council”) have determined that a Public Inquiry should be held to consider an objection to the Application which has been made to the registration authority, the Central Bedfordshire Council, Technology House, 239 Ampthill Road, Bedford by Mr A Richardson (“the Applicant”), who has recently notified the Council that he cannot now continue with his application for personal reasons and, therefore, another person may assume that role, under Section 15(1) and 15(2) of the Commons Act 2006 for the inclusion in the Register of Town or Village Greens of the land described in the Schedule hereto, which it is claimed has qualified for registration as a Town or Village Green by virtue of the use of the said land for the purposes of lawful sports and pastimes “as of right” and without challenge by the landowner for a period of over 20 years.

Description of the land claimed to have qualified for registration as a Town or Village Green
