# **Run competitions**

# Get everyone in your school excited about road safety and hold your own competitions.

#### Here's what you need to do:

- get help from your teacher to decide the best time to run your competition.
- decide who are you doing the competition for, your class? Your year group? Or even the whole school?
- check out the yearly planner and search the websites to pick a topic.
- decide what competition you would like to run we have added a few ideas and activities in this pack for you.
- promote your competition by tell everyone. Ask your teacher to help you with ideas to promote this.
- now you need a judge, ask your teacher to pick the winner.
- give out certificates for each winner, there is a template for you to photo copy. Add their name, class and the competition they have won.
- why not announce the winners in assembly? Present their certificate for the rest of the school to see their achievement.
- prizes your teacher may be able to help you. You can even give out class/house points or perks within the school for free.

# **Competition ideas**

#### Here are some ideas for competitions:

- use one of our handy activities in this pack
- design a poster with your chosen road safety message
- create a short play or advert, you could film it and show it in assembly
- write a story or a song
- design and make some bright clothing and other products to keep you safe when out and about
- draw a map and plan a safe route to school, include all the locations where you will need to use your green cross code.
- make a leaflet, show your School and your parents how to stay safe

If you have your own ideas then talk them through with your teacher or the Central Bedfordshire Council road safety team.

Here are some handy tips to get the most out of your poster:


- place it on the school notice board and make sure to add a photo of yourself so that everyone knows who you are.
