PINCHPOINT FUNDING - WOODSIDE LINKE, CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE

I write in order to support Central Bedfordshire Council in their Pinchpoint funding bid for the Woodside Link.

The Houghton Regis Development Consortium (HRDC), a collaboration between Lands Improvement Holdings, and Friends Life Limited, have undertaken to make a contribution of £45 million towards the construction of the A5 M1 link which is a total of £150 million. This road scheme unlocks planned residential, and commercial development to the north of Houghton Regis.

A planning application for up to 5150 new houses and commercial development was submitted to Central Bedfordshire Council in December 2012. The financial contribution to the A5 M1 link is conditional upon the grant of planning permission for this scheme.

The delivery of the Woodside Link, the first segment of which enables over 1 million sqft of commercial development, is essential to the overall scheme. Without the Woodside Link there can be no local connection to the strategic road network at j11a and the whole development becomes undeliverable. The attached graphic provides an indication of the initial scheme benefits.

In addition to the significant pump priming contribution, in order to facilitate the delivery of the Woodside Link, HRDC will ensure that land required for construction and associated works is committed to the scheme subject to the terms of a normal s106 planning agreement. A separate land agreement between Central Bedfordshire and the developers is in preparation as part of the Woodside Link DCO application.

We would urge central government to look favourably upon the bid for this vital missing piece of growth generating infrastructure, housing and employment which is critical to local and national growth.

I am writing on behalf of the Board of the South East Midlands Local Enterprise Partnership (SEMLEP) to support the bid for pinchpoint funds for £5m to contribute to the construction of the Woodside Link road.
