Notice of Confirmation of Modification Order Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981

Definitive Map and Statement for the former the Former Ampthill Urban and Rural Districts as at 27 January 2009

CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE COUNCIL (DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT FOR BEDFORDSHIRE) (MAULDEN: PARTS OF FOOTPATH NO 11) MODIFICATION ORDER 2010

On 17th February 2012 the Central Bedfordshire Council confirmed the above-named Order without modification.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by:

deleting from them that part of Footpath No 11 Maulden marked by a bold black line on Map One which extends from its junction with another part of Footpath No 11 Maulden at a farm gate at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OS GR) TL 0533 3777 in a north easterly direction for approx 101 metres to a fence boundary at OS GR TL 0542 3782 then continues in a north easterly direction for approx 52 metres to OS GR TL 0547 3785 then continues in a north north easterly direction for approx 37 metres to its junction with another part of Footpath No 11 Maulden at OS GR TL 0548 3788.

and adding to them the following footpaths:

The first part of Footpath No 11 Maulden to be added is marked by a bold black dashed line on Map Two and extends from its junction with another part of Footpath No 11 Maulden at a kissing gate at OS GR TL 0533 3777 in a north easterly direction between the two sets of hedges for approx 102 metres to a gap at OS GR TL 0542 3782 then continues in a generally north easterly direction on the northern side of a hedge for approx 50 metres to a kissing gate at OS GR TL 0546 3785 and then continues in a generally north easterly direction along a gravelled access track for approx 50 metres to its junction with Ampthill Road at OS GR TL 0549 3789. The path has a width of 1.2 metres between points A – D and a width as bounded by the existing fences and house of between 4.0 metres and 5.0 metres between points D - E.

The second part of Footpath No 11 Maulden to be added is marked by a bold green dashed line on Map Two and extends from its junction with another part of Footpath No 11 Maulden at OS GR TL 0533 3777 in a north easterly direction for approx 101 metres to a field boundary at OS GR TL 0542 3782 then continues in a generally north easterly direction for approximately 50 metres to a kissing gate at OS GR TL 0546 3785 and then continues as marked by a black dashed line in a generally north easterly direction along a gravelled access track for approx 50 metres to its junction with Ampthill Road at OS GR TL 0549 3789.

The path has a width of 1.5 metres between points A - D and a width as bounded by the existing fences and house of between 4.0 metres and 5.0 metres between points D - E.

The third part of Footpath No 11 Maulden to be added is marked by a bold pink dashed line on Map Two and extends from its junction with another part of Footpath No 11 Maulden at OS GR TL 0533 3777 in a north easterly direction for approx 101 metres to a fence boundary at OS GR TL 0541 3783 then continues in a north easterly direction for approx 46 metres to a field boundary at OS GR TL 0545 3786 then continues in a generally north easterly direction for approx 38 metres OS GR TL 0548 3788 and then continues as marked by a bold black dashed line for approximately 14 metres to its junction with Ampthill Road at OS GR TL 0549 3789. The path has a width of 1.2 metres between points A - F - G - E..

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of Countryside Access Team, Central Bedfordshire Council, Borough Hall, Bedford, MK42 9AP and may be inspected free of charge between 9.00am and 5.00pm on Mondays to Thursdays and between 9.00am and 4.00pm on Fridays. Copies of the Order and map may be purchased.

The Order came into force on 17th February 2012, but if a person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or any provision contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under paragraph 12(1) of Schedule 15 to the Act within 6 weeks from 23rd February 2012 make an application to the High Court.
