


## Priority Roads for

## **Extreme Weather Conditions**



A 'Resilient Highways Network' identifies the particular roads that would be given priority during adverse events, such as extreme weather. When extreme weather occurs (floods, storms, ice, snow etc), the main concern for the council will be to keep these roads open in order to maintain economic activity and provide access to key services.

We are inviting residents to have their say on the Resilient Highways Network and invite comments regarding the prioritised roads and services that have been identified.
