Highways Act 1980

CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE COUNCIL (TODDINGTON: PART OF FOOTPATH NO 58) PUBLIC PATH EXTINGUISHMENT ORDER 2019

The above Order made on 1 February 2019 under Section 118 of the Highways Act 1980 will extinguish Footpath No 58, Toddington as shown on the Order map.

That length of Footpath No. 58, Toddington to be stopped up extends from its junction with Kimberwell Close at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OS GR) TL 0095 2799 (Order map – point A) in a generally south easterly direction for approximately 84 metres through the rear gardens of Nos. 5-15 Bradford Road to OS GR TL 0100 2792 (Order map – point B) and then continues in an east north easterly direction for approximately 18 metres through the rear gardens of Nos 15, 17 and 19 Bradford Road to OS GR TL 0102 2792 (Order map – point C) then continues in a south easterly direction for approximately 115 metres across the Toddington Parish Council recreation ground to terminate at its junction with Bridleway No. 58, Toddington at OS GR TL 0109 2784 (Order map – point D).

The footpath is stopped up across its full width.

A copy of the Order and the Order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at the offices of Central Bedfordshire Council Highways, Priory House, Monks Walk, Chicksands, Shefford between 9.00am and 5.00pm on Mondays to Thursdays and between 9.00am to 4.00pm on Fridays. Any representations about or objections to the Order may be sent in writing to the Senior LSG Officer, Central Bedfordshire Council Highways, Priory House, Monks Walk, Chicksands, Shefford, SG17 5QT not later than 15 March 2019. Please state the grounds on which they are made. Representations and objections must include either a postal or e-mail address. Any representations or objections made will be in the public domain and will be available for viewing/copying by members of the public.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn the Central Bedfordshire Council may confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for confirmation any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the Order and will be made publicly available by either the Council or the Planning Inspectorate.
